MAIN POINT

1. TAKE PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY

Prov. 4:23 Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it.

PARABLE OF THE SOWER

Mark 4:3-8 & 13 "Listen to this! Behold, the sower went out to sow; as he was sowing, some seed fell beside the road, and the birds came and ate it up. Other seed fell on the rocky ground where it did not have much soil; and immediately it sprang up because it had no depth of soil. And after the sun had risen, it was scorched; and because it had no root, it withered away. Other seed fell among the thorns, and the thorns came up and choked it, and it yielded no crop. THE PARABLE OF THE SOWER EXPLAINED

"Therefore hear the parable of the sower: When anyone hears the word of the kingdom, and does not understand it, then the wicked one comes and snatches away what was sown in his heart. This is he who received seed by the wayside. But he who received the seed on stony places, this is he who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; yet he has no root in himself, but endures only for a while. For when tribulation or persecution arises because of the word, immediately he stumbles. Now he who received seed among the thorns is he who hears the word, and the cares of this world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and he becomes unfruitful. But he who received seed on the good ground is he who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and produces: some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty."

2. BE HEARERS AND DOERS OF TRUTH - BE HONEST WITH OURSELVES.

James 1:22 But prove yourselves doers of the word, and not merely hearers who delude themselves.

3. PRACTICE UNSELFISHNESS

Selfless - concerned MORE with the needs of others than ones own.
